Of Issachar, men who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do

Times:

You see, the Greeks had three distinct concepts of time: aion, chronos and kairos.

- Personified as gods, Aion represented the everlasting eternity of the Greek Cosmos,
- The ages

Heb 11:3

By faith [that is, with an inherent trust and enduring confidence in the power, wisdom and goodness of God] we understand that the worlds (universe, ages) were framed and created [formed, put in order, and equipped for their intended purpose] by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things which are visible.

Chronos and Kairos

"Every kairos is a chronos, but not every chronos is a kairos." — Hipporates

- It seems simple enough on the face of it, but what does time really mean?
- If you'd asked an ancient Greek to define it, he would have asked you which aspect of time you were talking about.

Chronos

Chronos - chronological (linear) or sequential time:

- We measure it with clocks Seconds lead to minutes, to hours to days, months, years
- It's the perspective that governs our daily lives.
- We also identify with occasions we call Christmastime and springtime, or when we talk of eras like or "Roman times".

whereas Chronos symbolized clock time

Kairos

Kairos is an Ancient Greek word meaning the right, critical, or opportune moment

Kairos signifies a proper or opportune time for action

- While chronos measures time in second, minutes, hours, days, months, and years – quantity
- Kairos measures moments
- Ripe time
- Understanding of chronological time leads to understanding of seasons and cycles
- It's a level of spiritual cognitive ability that can only be discerned in God's presence – by revelation
- It's about understanding the quality of time rather than the quantity of time
- Ancient Greeks made a distinction between quantity of time and its quality –
 between the chronos and Kairos

This can be best understand by the following questions:

- What time is it? usually answered in chronological terms Chronos
- What is it time for? Draws us closer to the meaning of Kairos.

In our present world – we live more in the Chronos – chronological world

- The concept of Kairos is lost
- The concept of *the appropriate time is lost*
- A time for an opportunity of a cycle
- Because we have lost the sense of Kairos opportune time, we fail to seize critical moments or opportunities
- Because we are so fixated on the chronology of time Chronos

Jesus' mother was not one tied to Chronology

- Chronology had it that Jesus had to do a few things and wait for some time before he could do miracles - Chronos
- But his mother had understanding of Kairos opportunity and she sensed one that required a miracle
- She sensed that something needed to happen and she made a call one that changed the entire wedding ceremony
- Therefore, she interrupted the chronos for a karios moment
- Today you and I too can make a call in the spirit that can change the whole trajectory of your life, your community and the world

Regarding our lives, community and the world

- The timeline for the scientists today— for a vaccine for COVID-19 to be available next year — chronos
- What is the Kairos?
- Kairos is a moment when the time is ripe to take destiny in our hands and thereby effecting change – that no man can do
- One that requires divine intervention its touching heaven saying they've run out of wine down their do something now
- It may not be your timing God but right now, we need some wine no time for the chronology

MORDOCIA

Mordocia had understanding of Kairos – times

Esther 1:13

Then the king said to the wise men who knew the times –

15. "According to the law, what is to be done to Queen Vashti, because she has not performed the command of King Ahasuerus delivered by the eunuchs?"

- Vashti is removed from her status
- And a new queen is sought
- Mordocia senses a Kairos moment positions his niece Esther a Jew
- He always had his ears attuned to events
- He knew how to position himself

Est. 2: 21

In those days, as Mordecia was sitting at the king's gate

• He discovers a plot to kill the king

In chapter 3 – Hamman the top ranking official in the kingdom plots to exterminate the Jews

In chapter 4 – Mordecai – learns of this plot

- Takes action
- Although no one was allowed at the king's gate he ventures there in sackcloth
- He inspires mourning, fasting, weeping and lamenting among the Jews
- What is he doing at the gate? He wants to catch the attention of Queen
 Esther who he had worked hard to put in the palace
- It was time to cash in on his investment for he had seen far knew that a time would come when they – the minority would need someone in proximity to power
- His only way to the heart of the kind was through Esther
- He sends a copy of the edict decreed in Susa for the destruction of the Jews

Esth 4: 8-9

It's shown to Esther with a command for her to go the king and beg for his favour and plead on behalf of her people

Esther's reply to Mordecia

Est 4:10-11 – it's not the time yet for anyone to go into the king's chambers

• She was still thinking in Chronos – linearly

Vs 12 – Mordcai's response

- In the kingdom at such a karios as this
- It's time to interrupt the Chronos
- Out with the law requiring surmons from the king before an audience with him can be attained

• You set the time – because more is at stake here

In the Kingdom at such a time as this:

- Kairos is extraordinary time, requiring interpretation. The capacity to read the signs of the times—the kairos—and respond is an issue of faith.
- Kairos is a dangerous time. It is critical to recognize it, for if you allow it to
 pass the loss will be immeasurable. There is a burden or responsibility tied up
 in the recognition of the kairos.
- Kairos time is here. It calls for action, conversion and transformation—a change of life.
- Kairos is not just crisis but opportunity and favour. God assists us in discerning the kairos—a moment of grace.
